WORDS FROM WANG – “Shift: A Conversation Worth Having”

The following is a letter from our new Wisconsin Conference minister, Franz Rigert.

Dear friends in Christ,

I am excited to introduce you to **Shift: from Maintenance to Mission**, a new conference-wide initiative designed to support your congregation in exploring fresh paradigms for ministry in the 21st Century.

Most of us assume the Christian Faith will still be around in 50 years; we just don't know what the ministry or the Church of Jesus Christ will look like! One thing is for sure – it will change. While many of us are focused on the decline of our congregations, we are also curiously aware of the rise of spirituality in our communities. This seems like a crazy contradiction, but in reality it is an exciting phenomenon. It may feel counter-intuitive, but God is calling the Church to a vision and a ministry beyond our buildings and budgets. God is calling us to the places where our Christian faith and the needs of the world intersect. At these crossroads, lives will be transformed as people from all walks of life work together for a more just and generous world.

The central idea around "Shift" is that **ministry will increasingly involve connecting, supporting and collaborating**. Imagine how many ideas we have not yet shared! Consider all the ways we could network and resource one another. Today as never before, the Spirit urges us to take thoughtful risks for the sake of bringing grace and goodness to this fragile and fearful world. This same Spirit calls all us to a Shift – from maintenance to mission – from the institutional patterns of the past to the entrepreneurial possibilities of the future.

Such a bold calling is daunting. That's why we want to invite your congregation into a conversation that will ultimately identify a particular dimension of your ministry in which you might consider making a strategic change. We are developing some areas of focus essential for 21st Century ministry: Spiritual Formation, Justice Ministries, Leadership Development, Alternative Ministry Models, and Community Engagement.

Back to *Words from Wang*. Now that our *Forward in Faith* campaign and building expansion projects are consuming church leadership a little less, I am excited for us to explore together some of the thoughts and offerings that our conference leadership has, and will continue to provide for us. In the coming months I will be bringing some of those resources to the table that we might engage in some thoughtful dialogue together; some of which we have already begun to consider as we boldly go where we have never gone before.



I was fortunate to have spent the first two weeks of May traveling in Turkey. Earlier this spring it seemed likely that the tour would be cancelled because of the political situation, but it went off as planned and proved to be an amazing trip. Since I thought I would not be going, I did not do my normal pre-trip study of the places I would be visiting. As a result, it was truly a voyage of “discovery and learning”, just as the brochure promised.

Modern-day Turkey bills itself as the “crossroads of Europe and Asia”, and that has been true for thousands of years. Istanbul (formerly Constantinople) is the only major city located on two continents. Turkey has always been a land of biblical importance. Mount Ararat is in Turkey, and so are the headwaters of the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers, believed by some to be two of the four rivers mentioned in Genesis.

The birthplace of Christianity is Palestine, where Jesus lived, preached, and died; the cradle of Christianity is Turkey. The Seven Churches of Asia mentioned in the first chapter of Revelation are all located in what is now Turkey. I had a chance to visit the sites for three of them: Ephesus (Efes), Izmir (Smyrna), and Pergamum (Bergama). According to tradition, Pergamum is where Satan dwells. The great altar of Pergamum, whose base can still be seen, is thought to be the “throne of Satan” referred to in Revelation.

The first seven ecumenical councils, accepted by both the Roman Catholic and Orthodox Churches, all took place in Turkey. The first was held in Nicaea in 325 A.D., three were held in Constantinople, one in Ephesus, one in Chalcedon, and the seventh again in Nicaea in 787 A.D.

The Apostle Paul, who played such an important role in spreading Christianity to a wider world, was born in Tarsus, now in southern Turkey. He lived and preached for three years in Ephesus and wrote to the church in Corinth from there. It is still possible to walk down the same main street that he did and to stand in the agora where he preached. You can see the indentations worn by chariot wheels in the paving stones of the street.

On his first missionary trip Paul sailed to Perge, now in ruins but worth a visit, and then worked in central Turkey. He sailed back to Antioch from Antalya, a beautiful city on the Mediterranean that is still an active port. On his third missionary journey he continued to establish churches, including one in Hierapolis. Hierapolis was an ancient sacred city with hot springs. A 2000-year-old theater seating 9700 people is still standing.

In the Cappadocia region, volcanic eruptions created a landscape that allowed people to carve out houses and later churches and monasteries in the soft rock. During Roman times, early Christians used these rock dwellings to escape persecution. In the Byzantine era, churches were cut into the rocks and decorated with frescoes. The natural climate control created by being underground has preserved some of these with their original brilliance.

Kaymakli is a complete underground city in the same region. For two hundred years, starting in the late 700s, Christians lived here to avoid the Arabs moving through Turkey. There are living quarters, kitchens, granaries, and ventilation shafts all underground, at different levels, connected by narrow corridors dug into the hill.

Turkey was not on my bucket list, and the main reason I went was to reconnect with a college friend who suggested we take this trip together. I now know it should have been high on my list of places to visit. I found it very moving to walk where Paul walked nearly 2000 years ago, to imagine living in cramped underground quarters to avoid persecution for my faith, to view the frescoes in the underground churches, and to be amazed by the mosaics in the churches of Istanbul that have survived for more than 1000 years.




Plymouth Children's Center receives funds from grocery stores
