WORDS FROM WANG – "Community Matters"

We have all become very accustomed to hearing and seeing the words "Black Lives Matter." And they do. We are also aware of the controversy around this slogan as well as the ones pertaining to gun control and/or violence. We are also entering the most heated time of the election season and emotions remain high as the chasm between groups and organizations continues to increase and divide us as a people. And then there's the natural disaster; floods, earthquakes, fires. One cannot help but feel overwhelmed and simply want to throw one's hands up and say I CAN'T TAKE IT ANYMORE. Worse yet, I FEEL HELPLESS.

But I say, do not despair. We are not helpless. And where does our help come from? I'm glad I asked that question. The Psalmist gives us one answer: I lift up my eyes to the hills from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. (Cue scratching needle sound across the record). Now hold on just a minute. Is that what we think? Our help comes from the Lord? Well, yes, theologically speaking. Truth be told, although we know God is our strength and our refuge in troubled times, help is often just around the corner, across the street, or even right next door. Help is right here in our own little community of Burlington, Wisconsin.

But if we believe this then we as a church have failed at some level because we have not taken our role as "help" to the community seriously enough. Oh, sure we volunteer at Love, Inc. and we do our free Christmas dinner, and we support some important ministries with our dollars, all noble pursuits. But at some level WE HAVE FAILED OUR COMMUNITY.

One of the questions I heard asked this summer was: "Is the quality of life higher in the community where your church is located as a result of your church being there?" I for one want to take this question very seriously. Therefore I am proposing the formation of a new team at Plymouth Church. I would like to call it "Community Matters." Furthermore, I would like the main purpose of this team to be about helping to improve the quality of life in Burlington. Who's with me?

I have already begun recruiting charter members of this team but if you are reading this and feel God is calling you to help in this effort then by all means, let me know. Finally, please read the "9/II" article that follows in this issue of the Epistle. It speaks for itself. In the meantime, let's get fired up for fall folks!


come and join our Wednesday night program, even if they can't afford to. Being a part of a church family is SO important to every child. If you feel you would like to sponsor a child this year please contact me.

9/11 @ 15:What Have We Learned? - October 11 @ 7:00pm. (Veterans Terrace)

The newly formed "Community Matters" team of Plymouth Church is planning it's first community event; this year to acknowledge the 15th anniversary of the horrific day we will always remember as "9/II." In light of all the tension in our society around the violence and negative rhetoric being experienced across

the nation Pastor Bob felt compelled to take the lead on this timely project and was therefore committed to enlisting the support and wisdom of the Muslim community and is pleased to have booked Mr. Ahmed Quereshi to come and address the greater Burlington community.

AHMED J. QUERESHI is the President of the Islamic Society of Milwaukee, the largest Islamic organization in Wisconsin, a position in which he has served since 2009. He has been a board member on the Interfaith Conference of Greater Milwaukee's Cabinet since 2003 and currently serves as Treasurer on its Executive Committee. In 2016, he was elected by U.S. and Canadian Islamic organizations belonging to the Islamic Society of North America, the largest Muslim organization in North America, to serve as a Community Representative on its Board of Directors.

Mr. Quereshi is an occasional instructor for the UWM School of Continuing Education where he teaches courses on Islam. He frequently speaks on Islam to non-Muslim audiences. He is an attorney practicing law with an office in Milwaukee and is a 1984 graduate of Marquette University Law School.

It is with great hope that the response to this event be significant in order that the Burlington community might show some support and solidarity with a people that have so often been misunderstood and mistreated that we might therefore take the opportunity to become more educated, concerned, and aware. As Christians, it is our responsibility to act on our beliefs that no person or group of persons receives anything less than the respect and love that they deserve.

The event is free to the public although Veterans Terrace will be offering assorted beverages at their cash bar during the evening. Light munchies will also be served. There will be an opportunity to make a donation to help defray costs for the event. If you have any questions please contact Pastor Bob or the church office.


